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How to revise using this resource:

Working with a friend or someone at home:

- Ask them to read the French words and you say the English translations.
- Switch round - they say the English and you have to say the French.
- Say a phrase in English or French, and your partner has to write it in the other language on their paper or whiteboard.
- One of you writes on a piece of paper or a whiteboard one of the phrases (one thing from each box) and the other has to try to guess it in 10 guesses or fewer.
- Both write 5 phrases (each with one thing from each box) on a piece of paper or whiteboard. Take turns to read out your phrases and see if you have any the same.

Working by yourself:

- Read out loud each phrase in French and then in English.
- Test yourself using the Studystack activities (see link).
- Find / work out the 3rd person forms (he/she/it) of the tenses.
- Find some other places or activities that would fit in the phrases and write down some examples in French and English.

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
