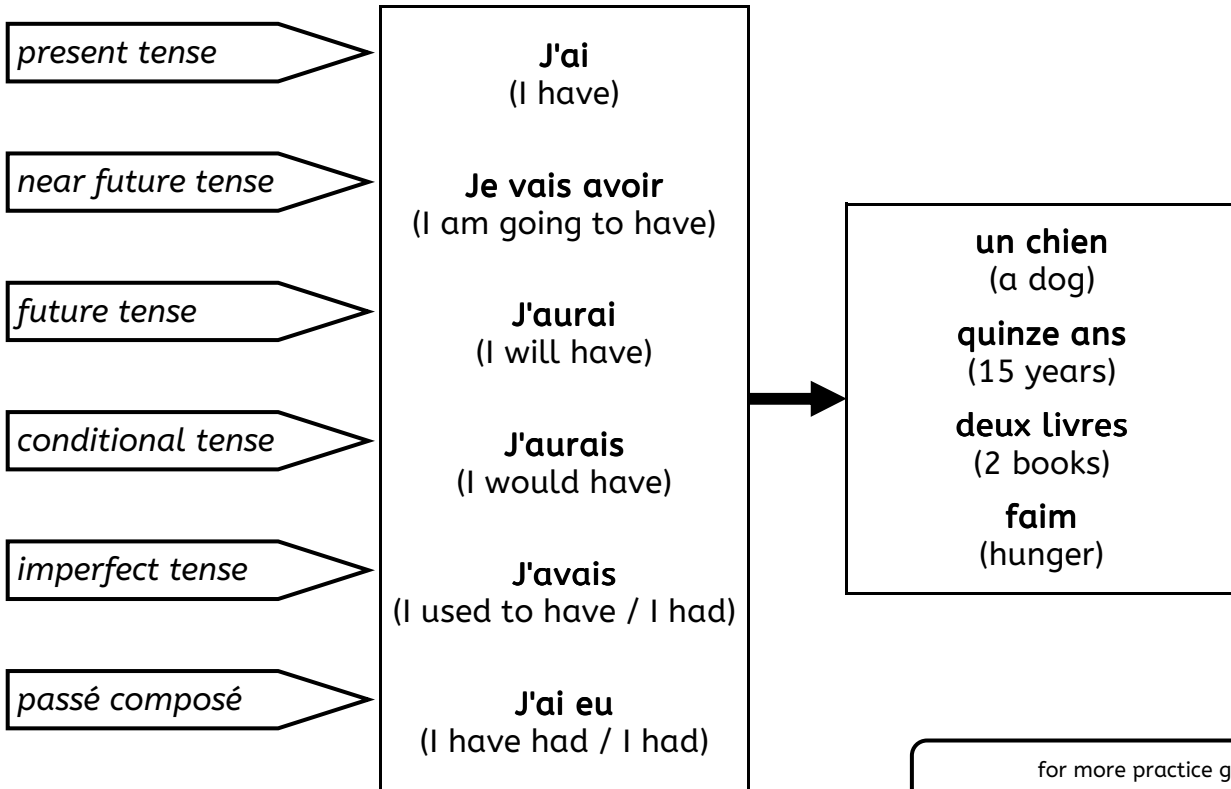
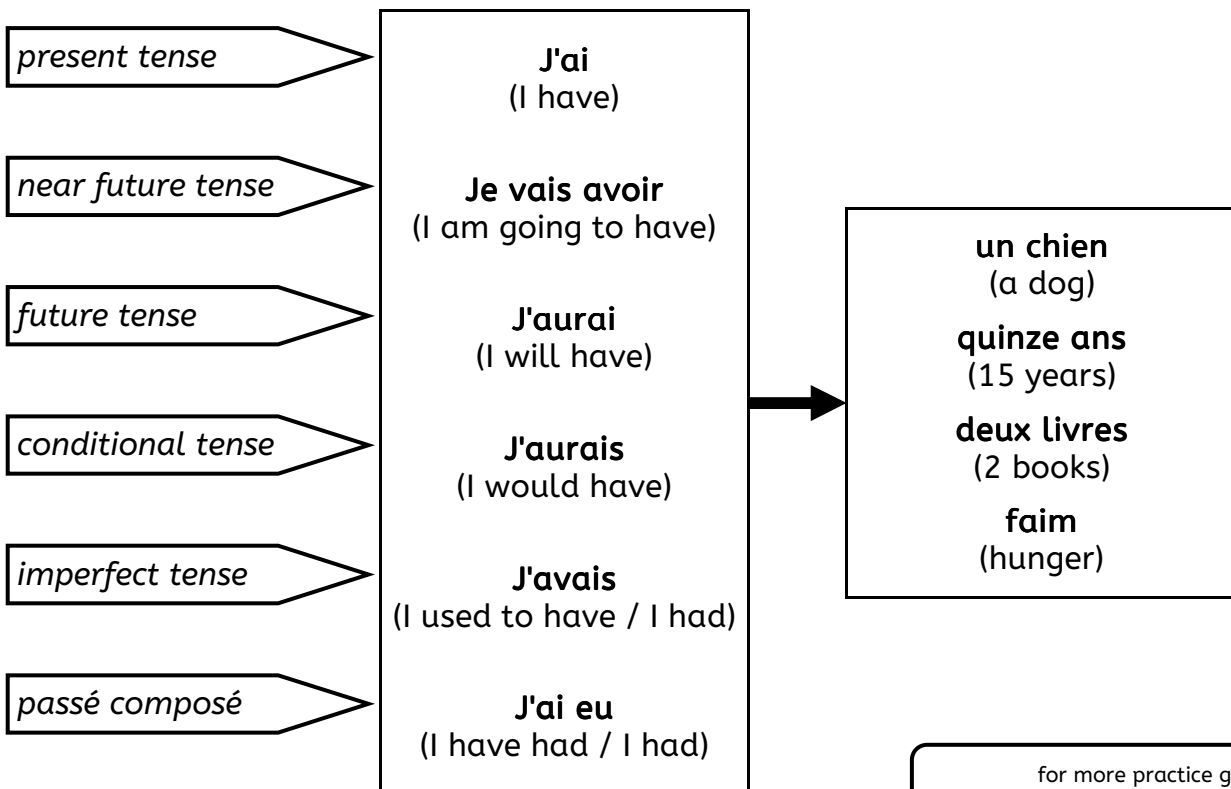

How to revise using this resource:
