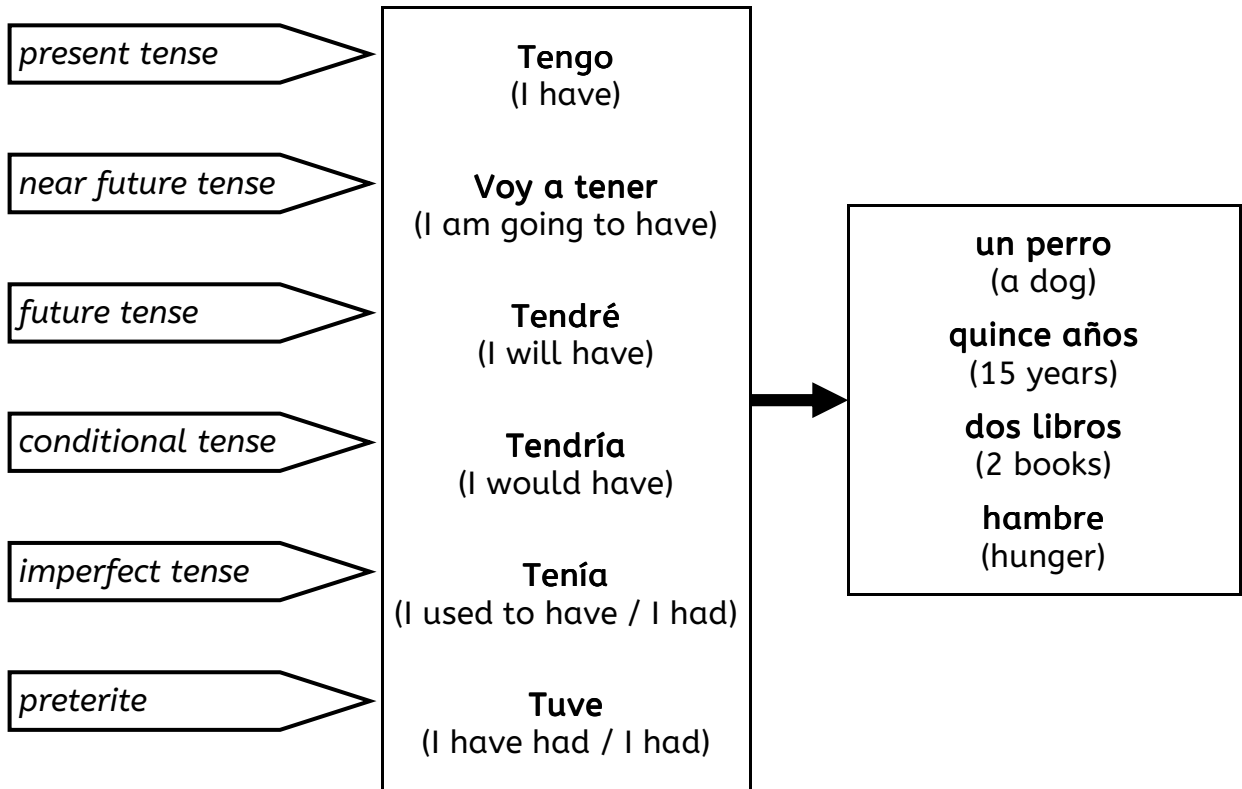
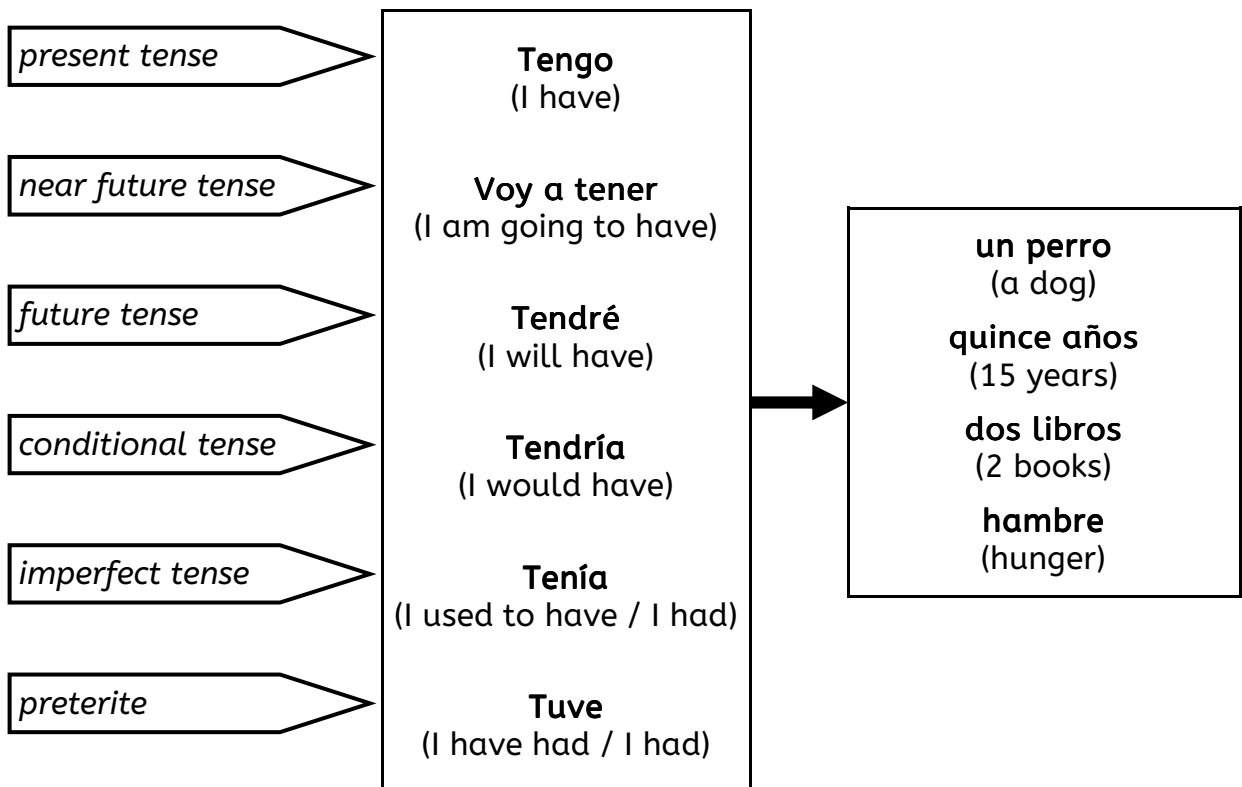

## How to revise using this resource:

### Working with a friend or someone at home:
