## Welcome to the MFL Sunderland Primary French podcast. Lesson 5a – The numbers 0-12

In this lesson you'll learn how to count in French from 0 to 12. You'll also learn how to play some games to practise the numbers with your class.

*To practise the numbers with your class you could also have a go at the “Higher Lower” game. You think of a number, and the children have to guess what that number is. They take it in turns to guess, and each time you tell them if the number you are thinking of is higher or lower than the guess. The children need to listen carefully to each other and to your answers so as to work out what your number is. Here are the instructions and vocabulary that you will need:*

*There are many other games and activities that you can use to practise numbers, and some of these are described on the lesson plan. You'll be able to use some of the equipment that you have in the classroom for numeracy, such as number fans. Here are some other suggestions for games you could play to practise numbers:*

- *Kim's game – pupils have to tell you which number is missing – and Noughts and Crosses. These two games have been described in previous podcasts.*
- *Flash past – show the class the number card very quickly, and they have to tell you which number it is.\**
- *Phone numbers – give the 0-12 number cards out to pupils. Then call out a sequence of numbers and the pupils have to come out to the front and stand in the right order.*
- *Strip bingo – a variation on normal bingo, and lasts longer. Pupils write five numbers along a strip of paper. You call the numbers out, and they tear them off, but only if they are on the end of their strip.*
